

Sport Premium Funding Report – 2016-17

Purpose of the report:

The purpose of the report is to provide governors with information on the academy's Sport Premium Funding and its impact on children's learning

At Essa Primary, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and wellbeing of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our £9,140 Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to provide high quality PE lessons using sports professionals from Premier Sports. The actual spend on the delivery from Premier Sport is £11,058

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years. That will mean £9,140 this academic year for our school. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Use of the funding at Essa Primary:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers from Premier Sports to teach the children in Years One to Four PE for at least one hour per week.
- On-going school led sport clubs after school provided by staff and resources purchased (cricket, multiskills, dance and athletics).
- Opportunities for More Able children to attend local events and tournaments for sporting activities.

Impact of the funding

The additional funding is used to make improvements in PE.

- The profile of sport across the school has been raised
- Children are keen to take part in high quality PE lessons – less children not bringing kit
- Increasing numbers of our children have participated in one or more external tournaments/more able events.
- Enhanced sports facilities for key Stage 2 children through some of the lessons being delivered in the Academy site.
- Throughout the year students from Essa Academy (prefects) support our children with playground games at lunchtime. This reflects a strong ethos of sport and the benefits associated with it.

In evaluating the impact of the Premium its use has improved PE and Sports provision.

PE Premium Funding Planning for 2017-18

During the next academic year, we will be retuning to specialist staff from Essa Academy delivering high quality PE in both Key Stage One and Two. This will also incorporate the delivery of extra curricular activities in preparation for attendance at local sporting competitions and activities,

The PE lead will be new to post in September and has a specific remit to increase the attendance of school at local sporting events. Support will be provided to all staff to ensure that all teachers feel confident in the delivery of their own PE lessons and that as a result the teaching and learning in PE will improve.

The Sport Premium money will be used towards the following outcomes:

- Teachers to have on-going access and support to an in-school PE Specialist

- All Children to benefit from sport, regardless of their ability
- Children have the opportunity to compete and participate in PE and Sport beyond the school day
- Staff to have access to CPD opportunities and training
- Purchase of Sporting Equipment for the school
- To be committed to providing a wide and varied number of opportunities in Sport and PE in order that 100% of our Key Stage Two children can participate in a competitive event.
